“Rorschach’s introversion would to us be the tendency to cast the ego in imagined situations, actions, or roles, and to apply the psychic energy not predominantly to adjustment to the outer reality and its digestion, but to a life in one’s own world of imagination. This tendency may lead to mere fantasies and day-dreaming but, if combined with adjustment to reality, may also lead to creative realization. To determine which of these alternatives is given in a Rorschach test, in the first line the experience balance is decisive, and in the second line, the syndrome of sense of reality.”
